MILWAUKEE COUNTY BUDGET LISTENING SESSIONS

Milwaukee County 2012 Budget Adoption Schedule

April 2012

Preliminary Preparation:
Direction to County
Departments on preparation of
the subsequent year budget.

July & August 2012

Department of Administrative Services and County Executive review of department budget requests.

Early June 2012

Departments submit new position requests.

August 13 2012

Department of Administration submits summary of budget requests to the County Board

October 2012

Finance and Audit Committee reviews the Recommended Budget in public budget hearings scheduled throughout the month. Check here for details on which departments are reviewed on which days.

November 5th, 2012

County Board Annual Meeting and the adoption of the budget and tax levy. During this meeting, the County Board acts on the Amendments by the Finance and Audit Committee as well as amendments submitted by individual Supervisors.

Mid-June 2012

Departments submit capital budget requests.

Departments submit operating budget requests.

September 27 2012

County Executive presents the Recommended Budget to the County Board. The Budget is then referred to the Finance and Audit Committee for review

October 29, 2012

County Board public hearing on the budget.

November 14, 2012

Consideration of County Executive budget vetoes and final adoption of property tax levy. The deadline for adopting the Milwaukee County 2013 Budget is November 5, 2012. An integral part of adopting an efficient and reasonable Annual Budget is receiving input from the public whose interests elected officials represent in the first place.

In order to effectively do so, Supervisor Taylor will be holding Budget listening sessions in all municipalities that are of the 9th part Supervisory District. The dates and times will be announced in near future.

LEGISLATIVE ROUND-UP

The Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors did not meet in August but it did convene on September 6, 2012 to address the resolutions acted upon at its July meeting, which were subsequently vetoed by the County Executive. The results were as follows:

- The Board voted 10-7 to sustain a veto from the County Executive on a resolution providing for an advisory referendum on whether the U.S. Constitution should be amended to establish that only human beings, not corporations, are entitled to Constitutional rights, and money is not speech, and therefore regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting political speech. Supervisor Taylor voted in favor of sustaining the veto.
- The County Executive's veto related to changing the line of reporting for the Department of Labor Relations from the County Executive to Corporation Counsel was overridden with a 16-1 vote. Supervisor Taylor voted in favor of the veto override.
- The Board voted 15-2 to layover a resolution relating to County Land Sales and the procedure for the disposition of real estate. Supervisor Taylor supported the layover.

128th AIR REFUELING WING VISIT

Supervisor Taylor participated in the tour of the Wisconsin Air National Guard's 128th Air Refueling Wing facility at General Mitchell International Airport on Aug 22, 2012. Participants had the privilege to fly aboard a KC-135R "Stratotanker" and witnessed an in-flight jet refueling. He was joined by 32 other elected officials, including State Representative Honadel.





Wisconsin Air National Guard's 128th Air Refueling Wing transfers fuel to United States' military and allied aircraft, provide aero-medical evacuation, and airlift personnel and equipment to strategic locations in a cost effective manner. In doing so they are protecting and defending the United States' global mission while simultaneously serving the communities of Wisconsin and incorporating a 24/7 National Guard Reaction Force.

ICE RINK IN HALES CORNERS

Featured in the last edition of "Privileged to Serve" was the effort to construct an ice rink in Hales Corners Park in honor of the 2010 Winter Olympics Speed Skating Bronze Medalist Aly Dudek. As part of the fundraising effort, the Friends of Hales Corners Park have teamed up with McDonalds – a long time Winter and Summer Olympics sponsor – to organize a fundraiser for this cause.
